I appreciate your comment on Senate 2325, introduced by Senator Humphrey to establish a Bureau of Accident Prevention.

Only within the last few days I had occasion to have this proposal carefully briefed, the better to determine what it would do, what additional powers it would concentrate in the Department of Labor and to what extent it would intrude the Federal Government further into the affairs of the people.

Unless this measure contains something that has not been disclosed on analysis, I would certainly oppose it as an unwarranted, futile step at this time.
