The House of Representatives on May 9 passed H.R. 15951, which provides for uniform annual observances for five legal public holidays on Mondays; namely, Washington's Birthday, third Monday in February; Memorial Day, last Monday in May; Labor Day, first Monday in September; Columbus Day, second Monday in October and Veterans Day, fourth Monday in October.

This bill is pending in the Senate Judiciary Committee with no action scheduled as of this date. You may be assured the matter will have my best attention. There are some differences in the House bill and Senate bills that have been introduced so there will be some adjustment or compromise before final passage could be made.
