Senator Dirksen then read the previously-prepared press release on this subject and after a minor change it was approved. A copy is attached.

Legislative Matters

Senator Dirksen stated that the Senate time-table was to recess on Friday after a pro forma session until next Tuesday at which time he intended to file a cloture petition on his Reapportionment amendment.

Congressman Byrnes stated that the House desires to have a conference as soon as possible on the Social Security Bill and he was of the opinion that Congressman Mills was adamant that there would be no Medicare provision when it came from conference. After general discussion as to what possible steps the House could take if, when unanimous consent was asked to send the matter to conference, there was an objection.

Senator Dirksen estimated that the Senate would adjourn sine die about October second.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 9:58 A.M.
