Includes correspondence with Strauss; sampling of editorial opinion; information compiled by the Republican Policy Committee; a statement of strategy to defend the nomination with assignments for various Senators, as well as drafts of speeches to be delivered, concerning the Dixon-Yates controversy, Strauss' record, and the Oppenheimer case. A copy of the 1945 report on the nomination of Henry Wallace as Secretary of Commerce and Dirksen's personal notes on the Strauss case are included.
2604-2616	Stricker, Adam (1958-60). Stricker headed Stricker and Hennings Research Associates, Inc., which Dirksen and the Senate Republican Policy Committee commissioned to collect information and draft reports on various legislative matters and to investigate backgrounds of witnesses before committees. Topics: voting records of Congress (accumulative rank position of entire Senate membership based on 162 ideological issues); a review of state and municipal spending proposals accepted or rejected by voters; a study of 89 votes in the 86th Congress, 1st Session, on which the Majority and Minority Leaders took opposite positions, arranged topically and in rank order; a comparison of 14 issues in the 1960 Republican and Democratic platforms.
