Topics: 1970 census; a history of Dirksen's eye trouble; proposed speaking engagements; requests; fund-raising plans for the Dirksen Research Center; Illinois position with regard to revenue-sharing; appointments to federal service; equal employment opportunity in federal contracts; reform of the State Department's passport division; Oklahoma's action on the reapportionment amendment; obscenity legislation; the Tax Reform Act of 1969.
